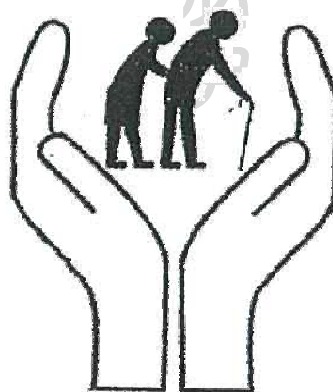

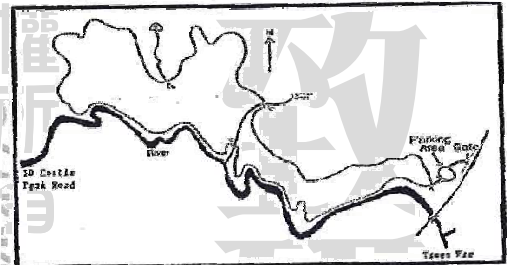

- H. Isabella is reading an article about a volunteer who sacrificed his life in a rescue work in China.

In memory of Wong Fuk-wing

Mr Wong Fuk-wing, who was born in 1964, had been an active participant in voluntary work in China since 2002. He sacrificed himself while volunteering at the Qinghai earthquake disaster in April 2010. He died and left his family behind. Although he lost his life, he opened up the eyes of many people with his positive attitude. He believed that he could contribute to a better mankind by doing volunteer work.

Wong was a truck driver, but in 2002, he quit his job and became a full-time volunteer. He set up an orphanage and took care of children who lost their parents. In 2009, he took part in the rescue work after the Sichuan earthquake. Over the years, he had helped many poor people in China. He even saved some of their lives.

After Wong's sacrifice, his family set up the Hong Kong Red Cross Wong Fuk-wing Memorial Fund to remember the selfless voluntary spirit of Wong. Hong Kong Red Cross (HKRC) has been entrusted by Wong's family members to receive and manage the donations received by the Fund, and to support and manage service projects in China.

Wong is our true hero. He has set a very good example for all of us. Like him, we can do a lot more to help our city too. We do not need to give up our lives as Wong did, but we can do much more, and should.

Mr Wong Fuk-wing is the glory of Hong Kong. All Hong Kong people are touched beyond words. He certainly deserves our greatest respect and appreciation. His great works remind us of the idiom, 'Actions speak louder than words'.

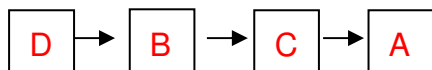
